

If the child goes abroad with one of the parents, presence of notarially issued permission (Letter of Consent) of the second parent on child's departure is obligatory.

Such permission is issued for the child with instructions of the period of action or for one certain trip.

Permissions of the second parent is not necessary if:

If mother/father has a certificate of single mother/father;

If one of parents has died (presence of the certificate on death)

If one of parents is deprived of the parental rights (the document on deprivation of the parental rights is necessary)

If there is a statement of the second parent for refusal of the child

In case of a long absence of one of parents (the document from court, verifying that it is impossible to define a site of the second parent)

In case one of parents refuses to authorise the child for travel, this problem is dared to be solved by judicial order.
